INSTRUCTIONS

The pupils' task is to interview other pupils, teachers, or why not passers-by to find out how well they know everyone's rights. Print out a handout on which the pupils can collect information provided by the people they interview! You can convert the data into graphic presentations using Excel, or manually on squared paper. The idea is to, together with the class, find out which rights were the best and the least well known. Also consider what the reason for this could be!

BACKGROUND

Everyone's rights are something unique for the Nordic countries. They were formerly known as everyman's rights. They mean that everyone can go out and about in the forest, regardless of who owns the land. Everyone's rights are free of charge and belong to everyone in Finland. When using the everyone's rights, however, you may not cause more than minor damage to the natural environment.
